

**PROTECTION OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY COMMITTEE  
MEETING MINUTES OF MONDAY, AUGUST 25, 2008**

This meeting of the Protection of Persons and Property Committee was called to order at City Hall at 4:00PM by Chairman Scott Ryan at City Hall.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Mayor Haske appeared to discuss the “Tour DaVita” Bike Tour that will be coming to Algoma September 18. This is a Kidney Dialysis Fund Raiser. Organizers will be in Algoma this week to finalize plans which include minimal street closures surrounding the Youth Club during the morning hours of 9/18, a Police escort into the City, and final closing ceremonies at Legion Park. **FIRE DEPARTMENT BY CHIEF TOM ACKERMAN:**

- \* Responded to 6 calls since last meeting
- \* Station and Mobile Cascade units have undergone maintenance and annual testing.
- \* Thank you to everyone who attended Shanty Days Porkie Pancake breakfast. There were 1089 served. Proceeds will go toward purchase of new hose nozzles.

**RESCUE SQUAD BY CAPT. KOSS:**

- \* Responded to 26 calls since last meeting
- \* After review of present scheduling methods, ARS will continue with present method.
- \* Will be “standing by” at all home football games
- \* Tim Parkos and Marty Baumann have joined ARS as drivers.
- \* Manned First Aid Station for July 20 Leukemia Bike Ride.
- \* Will participate in Kewaunee Nuclear Plant terrorist drill Sept. 10. In preparation, ARS participated in “tabletop” 8/13, and Mass Casualty drill 8/20.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT BY CHIEF MAGNO:**

- \* Department responded to 275 calls since last meeting
- \* Algoma Night Out was another success with estimated attendance of 750.

- \* Shanty Days was relatively incident free.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE OFFICERS BY CHIEF MAGNO:**
