Zoning Board of Appeals Minutes  
Thursday, October 10, 2019

The October 10, 2019 meeting of the Zoning Board of Appeals for the City of Algoma, was called to order in the City Council Chambers at 6:09 PM by Chairman Hutter.

Present at roll call: Bruce Charles, Don Guth, Chuck Hutter, Harold Nell, and City Clerk Jamie Jackson. Bill Bush was excused.

The City Clerk noted that the October 10, 2019 agenda was posted on bulletin boards in City Hall, Library and the Algoma Utility office. A public hearing notice was published in the Green Bay Press Gazette on September 26, 2019, and mailed to the surrounding property owners on September 23, 2019. The Chairman declared that the meeting was in compliance with the open meetings law. There were no changes to the printed agenda.

Nell moved, seconded by Charles, to approve the minutes of the August 20, 2019 regular meeting of the Zoning Board of Appeals. Motion carried.

ZBA Case No. 2019-02 was brought forth by applicant Steve Bathke, to request a variance from the City of Algoma Municipal Code Chapter 18 which allows for accessory buildings to have a maximum eighteen foot building height. Mr. Bathke wishes to construct a storage building at the rear of his parcel at 1600 Birch Street, Parcel 31 201 D 1ST 16, with a maximum building height not to exceed twenty-one feet.

The Chair opened the public hearing on ZBA Case No. 2019-02 and called upon those present and wishing to comment on this case. Joe Feld, 1627 Birch Street, was present and expressed his support of the variance and indicated that he too had been granted a variance in the past to exceed the maximum building height. There were no others present wishing to comment on the matter.

At the close of the hearing, the members of the board discussed ZBA Case No. 2019-02 and asked questions of the applicant. Nell moved, seconded by Guth, to grant the variance request to Steve Bathke for purposes of constructing a storage building at 1600 Birch Street, Parcel 31 201 D 1ST 16, with a maximum building height not to exceed twenty-one feet and directs the Building Inspector to issue a permit. Motion carried.

A motion was made to adjourn at 6:15 p.m. by Nell, and seconded by Charles. The motion carried, and the Board stood adjourned until further notice.
